# ARRIVAL IN ALTER DO CHÃO

The nearest airport is Santarém (STM), which is about a 30-minute drive away. Alter do Chão will be the starting point for our boat trip.

# DAY 1 | THE AMAZON WELCOME

#### THE CHARMS OF THE FRIENDLY VILLAGE OF ALTER DO CHÃO

From the airplane window, the immensity of freshwater of the Amazon in Pará welcomes you to Santarém! Our team awaits you at the airport for the 30-minute drive to Alter do Chão, where we will board from 3:00 p.m.

After settling in, there will be an introduction to the boat and safety procedures, followed by a baptism with a first dip in the Tapajós River. Free time for swimming.

You can also explore one of the friendliest villages in the entire Amazon, which boasts good restaurants along the waterfront and around a charming central square, as well as shops selling indigenous crafts.

Dinner on board is included.



# DAY 2 | TAPAJÓS NATIONAL FOREST

#### THE GIANT KAPOK TREE IN THE TAPAJÓS NATIONAL FOREST

Shortly after breakfast, we will disembark in the Tapajós National Forest (also known as FLONA), an important conservation area spanning over 500,000 hectares (1,235,500 acres). We will moor near the Jamaraquá community, surrounded by pristine nature, and if the group is up to it, we will embark on a long hike through the primary forest, exploring one of the most enchanting streams in the Amazon until we reach the legendary giant kapok tree (samaúma). Nicknamed the "grandma of the forest" for its impressive 600 years, according to expert calculations, this Amazon giant is extremely generous. Its long branches and dense canopy provide a home and support for several species of plants, birds, and other animals. The hike can be shortened, according to the group's preference.

We return for lunch onboard. Free afternoon for swim in the Tapajós river.

The highlight for this evening is to go up to the deck to admire the sky, stars, and the sounds of the Amazon rainforest.

# DAY 3 | JARI CHANNEL and COROCA COMMUNITY

#### THE AMAZON DAWN AND ITS FAMOUS BLACKWATER RIVER

In the morning, we will arrive at the Jari Channel, a small branch of the mighty Amazon River, where we will see its diverse fauna treasures. One of the greatest spectacles is the Amazon dawn! Listening to the symphony of birds in this precious universe is a moment reserved for a few adventurers.

Then we will continue navigating until we reach the blackwaters of the Arapiuns River, with its stunning forest scenery and white sand beaches. Get your camera ready: river dolphins may show up to accompany our journey.

In the late afternoon, we will meet the Coroca community, another important village in the region. We will visit the turtle lagoon and the nursery of the turtle recovery project and take a break at the beautiful shop of high-quality, original handicrafts made by the community. We will have a real lesson on the importance of sustainable tourism for the preservation of wildlife and all the people who live off the forest.

After resting from the excursion, we will serve a special dinner on board, carefully prepared by our crew with the best of Pará cuisine.

# DAY 4 | SÃO MARCOS COMMUNITY

#### THE MILLENNIAL TRADITION OF FLOUR PRODUCTION

On this day, we will enrich our knowledge of the Amazon by visiting, right after breakfast, a typical *casa de farinha* (flourmill), where we are invited by the São Marcos community to watch the process of making cassava products – a staple food for forest peoples.

We will return to relax and enjoy the beach. Our crew will be ready to prepare caipirinhas with local fruits, serve irresistible, traditional snacks, or hang a hammock under the shade of a tree for you.

To celebrate the last night of the trip, we will meticulously prepare a special dinner on the beach with the traditional Piracaia: grilled fish.

# DAY 5 | THE FINAL PLUNGE


## THE RETURN TO ALTER DO CHÃO

On the last day of the trip, we will wake up in the green waters of the Tapajós River, with a stop for a farewell swim.

Then we will return to Alter do Chão for disembarkation. Our team will guide the group to the transfer to Santarém Airport, considering that most passengers usually board the flight around noon.

\*On this last day, only breakfast and transfer to the airport or Alter do Chão are on us.





# OUR RATES:

R\$11,900 per adult in a double cabin

R\$16,900 per adult in a single cabin

R\$9,900 for children up to 11 years old

For a master cabin, add R\$1,000.00.

Once we confirm a minimum of 4 adult passengers, the trip is guaranteed. We will confirm the departure no later than 30 days from the scheduled travel date, as soon as we reach the minimum number of passengers to form the group.

Children accommodated with only one adult in the cabin pay the same rate as adults.

Children traveling with two adults are usually accommodated in a nearby but separate cabin. For 9 or more passengers, we use one of our larger boats, and in this case, there is the option to accommodate one child in the room with the parents.

# PAYMENT METHOD:

In installments by bank transfer: 50% deposit + 50% due up to 30 days before departure or 60 days for bookings for the period from Dec. 20 to Jan. 10.

The booking is not confirmed until the deposit is received.

### CANCELLATION POLICY:

Cancellation up to 90 days before the departure date: a 10% charge over the total trip cost will be levied


Cancellation from 89 to 46 days before the departure date: 30% of the total trip cost will be retained.

Cancellation from 45 to 22 days before departure: 50% of the total trip cost will be retained.

Cancellation 21 days or less before departure: an 80% of the total trip cost will be retained...

For all bookings for the period from December 20 to January 10 and for Carnival week, the cancellation fee will be 100% of the amount paid.






No one better than the people who live in the forest to show us the beauties of nature around them, the richness of their cultures, and the wisdom of the forest, passed down by the ancients and revived in each new generation. The riverside communities we will visit on the trip have from 50 to 400 inhabitants. Each day, our hosts will enrich our knowledge of the Amazon by sharing their experiences and practices: fish farming, production of cassava flour and honey, forest medicine, local cuisine, handicraft techniques, endangered species recovery projects, and hiking in their territory for us to admire wildlife.



Feeling connected and part of the largest biodiversity reserve on the planet is to awaken awareness of the size and power of the Amazon rainforest and our place in the world. Hikes through secondary and primary forests, guided by the trained eyes of our community and village hosts, are rare opportunities to learn about the role of every living thing in this immense ecosystem and appreciate the fascinating forest universe. Hikes last from 1 to 5 hours and are tailored to the group's profile.



In general, the Amazon is not the ideal destination to spot animals. But some forest characters make a point of welcoming our travelers, such as pink river dolphins, tucuxis (grey dolphins), sloths, monkeys, and numerous species of birds.



When rivers are low, from July to March, beaches and sand paths are revealed, forming small freshwater paradises.

We have selected the best landscapes for memorable dives during the trip.



*Igapó* is flooded forest during the high water season. A fantastic immersive experience that allows us to glide by in canoes and enter this ecosystem, almost reaching the treetops.

*Igarapé* is a creek flowing through the forest, formed by spring waters, always at a refreshing temperature. Gifts from nature to those who deserve to recharge their bodies from the hike and feast their eyes with a magical scenery hidden deep in the forest.




The dining experience during our trip is off the charts. Amazonian flavors can be tasted throughout the day, from delicacies at breakfast on board, appetizers served on the beach, to a variety of fish and regional recipes prepared for lunch, special dinners, and the famous *piracaia* (barbecue). The local fruits used in drinks or as an ice cream will conquer your taste buds. If you have any dietary restrictions or preferences, we can make adjustments to the menu.



You will learn a popular technique in this region for making handicrafts of straw from the tucumã palm tree, native to the Amazon. Artisans create a wide variety of pieces through the dyeing process. Impossible to resist such a special souvenir.

Wood carvings in the shapes of local animals, bead necklaces, and earrings can also find space in your luggage.



For those interested in sport fishing, we can include it in the itinerary, in areas where fishing for piranhas is permitted. A condition for this activity is to release the fish as soon as possible:)


#### WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO ENJOY THIS TRIP?


Anytime! Have you ever heard that you never step in the same river twice? The waters of the Amazon are constantly changing the landscapes, making your experience unique.

In the dry season (July to December), the beaches steal our gaze. In the flood season, it is possible to canoe through the flooded forest and reach the treetops, an experience far beyond the ordinary.

The temperature is warm all year round, and a constant pleasant breeze blows while sailing.

The rainy season is in the first half of the year. Rains are usually heavy but short-lived and do not disturb our trip. The second half of the year is the dry season, when rains are less frequent.


